Deacon's Report

This past year has been an exciting one for me. First, I retired after working for fifty-three years, starting with my dad building new homes and last working for Wal-Mart.

This past February, Deb and I attended the Episcopal Urban Caucus in Raleigh, NC. Deb went sightseeing while I attended the Caucus. It's always great to see old friends who are doing the same ministry and meet new friends. I was elected to the Board again. After the Caucus, Deb and I visited her brother and family in Charleston, SC.

In April I went with three other deacons, two from Iowa and one from Minnesota, to New Orleans for one week to help repair homes for families that were hit by hurricane Katrina two years ago. It was a great experience to meet so many deacons from across the United States and Canada who came for the week to work on homes. What was also great was to hear about the different ministries we were doing and meeting the families that were still recovering from Katrina. It's a great shame to see how our government and the insurance companies let the people down but it's exciting to see how the Episcopal Church was helping the families. I did get a chance to see parts of downtown New Orleans and taste the great food and bring coffee back to Mitch.

In June I traveled with the youth from Trinity on their mission trip to Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota to repair homes. Our youth were awesome. They worked hard on the homes and they grew spiritually as a group. Some were even put in charge of the repairs. All the homes were done on time, which was the first it ever happened.

I also visited a camp at Amarillo, Texas called Promise Camp, a camp for children with parents in prison. I was asked by the Bishop and the JPIC Commission to work on. I'm hoping to start on up in 2008. I have formed a committee to work toward this ministry. I will share more about this as the year goes on.

I also attended the Province VI of the Episcopal Church in Omaha, Nebraska as a delegate. Again it was great to meet old friends and make new ones and see what other Dioceses are doing. At the Ministries Retreat in Grinnell, Iowa I helped with the three day workshop on Anti-Racism which is required for new clergy, diocesan, all commission members. Also attended Anti-Racism training in St. Louis, MO and Yakima, WA.

Still going to Anamosa State Prison two to three times a week for bible study and church services. Also mentoring with a young man once a week for the past three months. He has set his goals and is working hard on them. He has a full time job and is attending Kaplan University in Cedar Falls. He is carrying a 4.0 grade average. It is so exciting to see him grow in what he wants to accomplish in life when given the chance. He has also grown spiritually as well.

I also have been busy in the community. Was elected Vice-President of New City Ministries which has kept me very busy and I also have been very active in the Eastside Ministerial Alliance.

So you can see it's been a busy year for me and 2008 is shaping up to be busy.

Christian Formation 2007

Every year my calendar provides a picture of the accomplishments for the year. This one has been a busy one and a time of changes in our programs here at Trinity.

To begin with we have said goodbye to some wonderful people who have served for years in our formation programs. This year both Kathleen Sallee and Diane Neuhaus have decided to pursue other ministry areas. We are grateful for their service with the Journey to adulthood program for our high school students. This class is now being led by David Kline with the assistance of Tim Nieman II. The class meets on Sunday mornings at 9:15.

Also new this year is the addition of a Sunday morning class for pre school children. The class is being taught by Carrie Nieman and meets at 9:15 in the preschool classroom across the hall from the Godly Play Worship Center. The curriculum, Beulah land, was developed by Gretchen Pritchard at an inner City church in Boston Ma. It is based around flannel board presentations of Bible stories and is a natural feeder to the Godly Play curriculum in place for grade school children. Our purchase of the beautiful material was made possible by a generous grant from the Mile of Pennies committee of the Church Periodical Club. With their help we were able to purchase enough stories and the accompanying program for two years of classes. We are thankful for their generosity.

Now for the busy calendar.

In January I was able to accompany Sue Genereaux, Diocesan Youth Missioner, to the 10 anniversary of the National Association of Episcopal Christian Education Directors (NAECED) meeting in Jacksonville Beach, Florida. This organization provides us with so much information and is a fantastic support group through its online list serve. The workshops that I attend there are used to supplement our programs here and in the Diocese.

Also in January I was elected co-chair of the Diocesan Youth Ministry Development Team. (YMDT) This organization develops Diocesan programs for families and children and acts as a clearing house for these programs. Among other things their portion of the budget pays for the licenses for Rite thirteen/ Journey to Adulthood curriculums. This saves us Curriculum costs for these programs. They also

Sponsor Diocesan activities for youth like the Ski Weekend, Happening, the conferences and the spring and fall forums. They also Offer trainings each year for J2A and Godly Play. I have enjoyed my years working with them.

February brought a trip to Dubuque for the ski week end. We had four young people from the area at the weekend this year and even Mitch took to the slopes. We hope that even more will make the trip this year.

March 28 I traveled to Omaha to hear a presentation sponsored by the united Methodist church at their Horizons of Faith Conference. The speaker was Walter Bruggeman, author and lecturer. I purchased the cds of Dr Bruggeman's presentation and they are available for check out in the formation office.

Our Shrove Tuesday pancake supper was prepared by the YAC (Young Adults in Community) group as part of the fund development for our youth mission trip. This group under the leadership of Chantel Boeschen, Chris Nieman and Tina Shellhorn worked hard all year raising the funds for their mission adventure. (More about that later) The Mardi Gras decorations and the servers were provided by the Godly Play classroom.

Wednesday night soup suppers focused on the Millennium Development Goals. Father Mitch led discussions on the goals each week and during Holy Week Bishop Scarfe was present for the supper, discussion and Tenebrae service.

In April the book club finished reading Marcus Borg's The Heart of Christianity just in time to travel to Cedar Rapids to meet with Dr Borg at a two day seminar sponsored by Prairie Woods Spirituality Center. In all four of us were able to take part in the two day event.

Several members of the church went to Cedar Rapids in May for an evening with the presiding bishop. We were impressed with her wisdom and relaxed response to even difficult questions. Her openness was comforting.

In June I attended another quiet day in Des Moines. These one day retreats presented by the Wholly Quiet Retreat Committee and are really a spiritual uplift. The presenters are usually from within

the committee and topics are appropriate to the season. A wonderful offering from the Diocese.

Near the end of June we sent our young people off on their mission trip to South Dakota. Thirteen people represented our church on a mission to people less fortunate we are. The trip would not have been possible without the love and support of the whole parish. The effect on our youth will last a lifetime.

The end of June was our first family camp at Clear Lake. It has been many years since we all went camping at Boone and it was fun to turn back the time and spend a portion of our summer together. Thanks to Bill and Cindy Kline for all their help in organizing and sharing time on the water with their boat.

In July we doubled the number of participants at the annual Ministries Retreat in Grinnell. The best part was the fact that there were so many returning for a second year and bringing a friend. It would be nice if our participation would continue to grow each year.

In August I was invited to receive certification as a National Godly Play Trainer. Completing the College of Trainers Course was an honor and only made possible by your support of this wonderful program. I have lost count of the number of classrooms in this Diocese that are the direct result of your belief in Godly Play and your generous sharing of our resources. I know that there are two new churches beginning this year – Maquoketa and Mason City.

Also in August Kevin Sanders and I recertified as EFM mentors. The Education for Ministry program is strong here at Trinity. This year Melinda and Kevin Davis, Jerry Raber, and Jo Capoccioni joined Diane Neuhaus, Helen Hill and Marian Mallory. If you are at all interested in EFM or curious about what the program entails feel free to contact any of us. We love to talk about it.

Throughout the school year I continue to bring Godly Play stories to the children of Trinity Pre School. It has even been fun to share our October movie night with some of the families. Our hope is to have more parish preschool activities in the future. The school is such an important part of our ministry to the community.

This year Alex Kline represented us as one of the diocesan Youth delegates to convention. Alex was

recognized for his service to the parish as an outstanding youth.

I also need to thank all of you for your love and support for my family in this time of our loss of the physical presence of our Brandon. His presence is missed even in the Godly Play classroom where he served so many years as door person. Grieving is best done in such a caring community. Thank you for being there.

Preschool Report

Our Preschool and Childcare has been in operation for a year and a half now. Many changes have taken place. Nicol' Geving left the position of Director in July. Karen Jensen assumed the position in

September. Currently, there are 36 children enrolled, from infants through school-age. We are waiting for our license renewal visit, which will let us know what changes still need to be made to meet regulations. The staff has stabilized after several changes. They are all dedicated, caring people who are committed to the well-being of all the children who come here every day. Robin Loes is now an assistant in the 2 and 3 year old classroom. We have student teachers from Hawkeye Community College in Carrie Nieman's classroom to learn how to work with preschool children. After trying Waterloo Schools lunches for a few months, we are now preparing all our own meals. We are sure we can provide nutritious food at a reasonable cost. We have made a conscious effort to keep our costs down, while also working to collect money due from families. It was necessary to raise our rates at the first of the new year to keep up with the increase in minimum wage. It has been a difficult change to make, but essential to our financial situation. Grant applications have been submitted for money to purchase equipment for the playground. The decisions should come in February. The purchase and installation of age-appropriate equipment for the playground, which already has fencing and surfacing, is a priority for 2008. Another priority is growth in enrollment. There are still spaces for more children ages 2-5 at this time. We will be doing some recruiting to find more families we can serve.

United Thank Offering

The United Thank Offering is a ministry of the Episcopal Church that provides a way for members of the Episcopal Church to give daily thanks to GOD. The discipline starts in the homes by dropping coins into a special container, known as the "Blue Box". These monetary gifts are used to help others.
